

## Module 1 Assessment 3: Research Family Tree

### Instructions

#### Part A

To explore family history and create a family tree, use at least **two (2)** ethnographic research techniques such as:

- Talking to family members or family friends and taking notes
- Searching government records such as local councils, State Registries of Births, Deaths and Marriages
- Searching for newspaper articles
- Searching for personal items such as letters, photos, medals, keepsakes
- Using websites such as:
  - [www.ancestry.com.au](http://www.ancestry.com.au)
  - <https://aiatsis.gov.au/>
  - <https://trove.nla.gov.au/landing/first-australians>

The family tree that you create will ideally be of your own family but may be of somebody else's family. If you can't use your own family, you must speak to your Trainer about available options.

Create and submit a family tree diagram. For each person in the family tree, try to provide their name and date of birth. Try to go back at least **two (2)** generations prior to your birth.

(You may include photos in the family tree if you wish, but it is not required.)

There are several methods you can use to create a family tree diagram. Choose one of the following:

Method 1: Download and complete the **Family Tree Diagram Template** provided in the assessment instructions on Moodle.

Method 2: Draw the family tree by hand, then scan it or take a photo of it and submit it.
